ACTIVITIES IN DETAIL

SSSR undertakes activities in different field which can be categorized and described as:

I. CHILD RIGHTS(EDUCATION)

“Towards a Protective environment for children in Rajasthan”

Project Purpose: By 2014, key child protection mechanisms in Tonk district with clear linkages to community based mechanisms are so functional that reduces by 30% incidences of child labour, child marriage and child abuse in 30 project villages.

Activities Undertaken:

1. Capacity building and technical support and guidance to key district and sub-district level Child Protection structures: regarding the effective planning, implementation and monitoring of various components of ICPS, JJ Act and other child protection laws and schemes in Tonk.
2. Facilitate/Contribute to development of user/implementer manuals, protocols, guidelines, handbook or electronic resource material.
3. Promote and strengthen district level civil society engagement or advocacy on child protection issues.
4. Strengthening Child Protection Committees (GPCPC and VCPCs) and Children's Collectives in project villages on their role and responsibilities towards prevention of and response to child rights violations; organise training programmes and facilitate monthly meetings.
5. Help VCPC and GPCPCs maintain a database of vulnerable children and their families at the village level and keep track of these children on a regular basis and link them to access the government safety nets and institutional mechanisms in place.
6. Facilitating interfaces among GPCPCs and VCPCs
7. Monitoring implementation of social security schemes and CP mechanisms in the project area and sharing it with appropriate authorities.
8. Use IEC materials and conduct low-cost no-cost awareness-raising events in 30 villages on Child Protection issues such as child labour, child abuse, corporal punishment, and child marriage as well as on government child protection schemes and systems.

These girls who are also the ex-member of child group, which is formed by Shiv Shiksha Samiti with the financial support from Save the Children. This is the greatest achievement for Shiv Shiksha Samiti and it's members. This shows their contribution and dedication.



PROJECT ANANYA, That's No Way to Marry- Enabling Protective Environment for Children and Integration of child protection with health and nutrition in Rajasthan



Objectives

- ☺ 3400 girls, and boys additionally, have knowledge and skills related to sexual and reproductive health and rights, in particular to child marriage.
- ☺ 1,000 PRI members, VHSNC/ VPMC members, VCPC/ GPCPC members and community support groups in 171 community locations have increased knowledge of the harmful effects of child marriage, no longer tolerate child marriage, and take action to stop child marriage
- ☺ Influencing and strengthening the implementation of legislation against child marriage (Prohibition of Child Marriage Act 2006) and of the child protection system at the state and district level (Integrated Child Protection Scheme)
- ☺ Improved access to SRH services for married and unmarried girls and boys

Strategies

- ✂ Social Mobilization, Demand Generation, Ensuring supply/support services, Capacity building of the community, Networking, advocacy, liaisoning ,Monitoring and follow up
Baseline and end line Survey

Approach

- ❖ Participatory and converging- all the stake holders of the project are involved strategically in the process starting from the planning to implementation and follow up. Steps are taken to converge with different Govt. developmental initiatives with the prescribed packages of intervention intended in the project.
- ❖ Strategic linkages with the local governance structure i.e. PRI and CBOs working in the villages along with the service providers at grassroots level like HW, AWW, ASHAs. Sustainability and following up strategies were formulated with the involvement of all above during the programme planning and implementation

Target Group

- ❖ Unmarried adolescent girls (13-20 years)
- ❖ Unmarried adolescent boys (13-20 years)
- ❖ Married non-parenting girls and boys
- ❖ Parents/family members of adolescent girls and boys
- ❖ Frontline health workers
- ❖ Members of local government structures: Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRIs), Village Health, Sanitation and Nutrition Committees (VHSNCs), Village Child Protection Committees (VCPCs), Panchayat Child Protection Committees (PLCPC).
- ❖ Staff of government departments such as the Department of Woman and Child Development, District Child Protection Unit, Panchayat Raj and Rural Development and other allied departments and child protection structures such as SJPU, CWC, etc.
- ❖ In order to prevent child marriage, it is important to target not only married and unmarried girls with information and skills, but also raise awareness among boys, parents and family members about the adverse health and socio-economic effects of early marriage. In addition, this project will enlist higher-level stakeholders such as



local, state and national governments in order to provide an enabling environment for cultural change through policies, laws, appropriate law enforcement and resource allocation.

5-day training of trainers on the life-skills module, an adaptation of the Ellen and Allan module of Save the Children, Sweden. The Indian version of the module has been rechristened as Lalita and Babu and contextualized in accordance with the Indian ethos. This method is based on the founding principles of UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) and intends to make children aware of gender discrimination by adopting a perspective based on equality, justice and rights. The module will be used to create discussion leaders in the age group of 15-25 years from the local communities who can work with girls and boys on improving their communication skills, empathetic abilities and critical thinking, and are equipped with knowledge about SRH issues and rights.



One day workshop of Newly appointed Panchayati Raj Institutions Representative were organized in which Vice JILA Pramukh Mr. Avadesh kumar Sharma and PRADHAN Panchayat Samiti Tonk Mr. Jagdeesh Gurjar, CR, DR and Sarpanch's were participated. In this workshop we discussed on the issue child marriage and its implications and shared about the

Project "Ananya that's no way to marry", which we are functioning in 74 villages of Piploo Tehsil and also share expectations with the PRI's for effective work in social evils like child marriage and also honored them for selecting as PRI's.



Two numbers of training and orientation programmes on ARSH and RSK were organised for Front Line Health Workers (FHW) in Tonk. The project team and the identified govt-certified trainers gave a brief orientation to 109(M-21 and F-88) ANM/LHV/MOs on 16th May 2015 during their district level meeting at Tonk. There were 26 ANMs in it who belonged to project area. Besides there was a special training programme on the same subject for 28 AWWs on 26th May 2015. Thus the target of training 100 Front Line Health Workers is completed, exceeding the target by 86.

Goal of the Project:

Creating enabling environment through education and community mobilization towards eradication of Child Labour in Bundi district of Rajasthan

Strategies

In order to eradicate child labour in the targeted geographical area, the project will primarily emphasis on education for all children in the school going age and community mobilization. This will be done through:

- Strengthening the existing mainstream education system and infrastructure in the community instead of starting parallel system, towards attaining greater sustainability.
- Strengthening other mainstream service providing institutions who contribute to the establishment of child rights, such as the Aganwadi centres and health centres etc.
- Running bridge centres for a limited time period to provide remedial/supplementary education
- Establishing Social Mobilizers, capacitating community women, developing local support groups to generate momentum for child rights and ensure sustainability for the intervention
